

The Problems

- Muslim women face unique challenges in accessing competitive career paths due to the intersection of multiple biases, including those related to race, gender, and religion. This creates a significant barrier to their professional advancement and limits their opportunities for growth and success.
- Despite their academic achievements, Muslim women often face significant barriers to employment in managerial and professional roles. This disparity highlights the systemic challenges they encounter in the job market.
- A lot of women realize only later in life that there are people out there to help and guide them, specially other muslim women that went through similar challenges.

Create a platform for muslim women in Tech around the world

- That promotes networking and mentorship among muslim women.
- Where muslim women can browse members of the platform to quickly find other women and connect with them
- Where they can request for a mentorship with a specific mentor online

Features

- Resources promoting the benefits of mentorship
- User signup and login
- A searchable database of mentors, with filters for skills, interests, and location.
- A messaging system for mentors and mentees to communicate with each other.
- A calendar for scheduling meetings and events.
- Resources and tools for mentors and mentees to use in their mentoring relationships.

Research and planning

Identify target audience: Define the specific needs and goals of the Muslim women we want to serve with this platform.

Conduct market research: Analyze existing mentorship platforms, identify gaps, and learn from successful models.

Define platform features: Determine the core features that will be essential for the platform, such as:

- Searchable mentor and mentee database
- Messaging system
- Calendar for scheduling meetings
- Resource library

Develop a project timeline: Create a realistic timeline for the development and launch of the platform.

Technical development

Choose technology stack: Select appropriate programming languages, frameworks, and tools for building the platform.

Content creation

Create high-quality content: Develop informative and engaging content, such as blog posts, articles, and videos, to attract and educate users.

Build a strong online presence: Utilize social media and other digital marketing channels to promote the platform and reach the target audience.

Collaborate with influencers: Partner with influential Muslim women in tech to increase visibility and credibility.

Plan of work for the building phase

- Priority features :
 - Home page, with content to promote mentorship (present the benefits of mentorship for muslim women, testimony of mentees)
 - Mentor browsing page (use an existing database or create a sample one)
 - Use mentee information to suggest a suitable match (develop a method to find best match for a given mentee)
 - Messaging system (needs to be defined, eg opens local email app to send an email)
- Define database
- Create wireframes
- Define design and layout
- Create tasks from wireframes
- Tech stack chosen :
 - Front end : React with Bootstrap-React
 - Backend : ExpressJS
 - Database : SQLite
 - Unit testing framework : Jest
- If possible ask for feedback from the community

Low priority features

- User sign up and log in
- Calendar for scheduling meetings,
- Resources and tools for mentors and mentees to use in their mentoring relationships.

Risks and Mitigation

Mitigation:
